

About The Book

Paul Hebert was born and raised in Alberta, Canada, in an age when you mastered the land you claimed by hand and horses. As a boy, he watched a man climb an electrical pole with his hands and the spurs on his feet, and Paul knew what he wanted to do with his life. Through a tumultuous early life, Paul survived alcoholism and brawls, and he thrived as a power lineman, enjoying the travel and adventure he found in skiing and the love he found with his new wife, Lorraine. On September 30, 1989, that all changed. On an emergency call, Paul suffered a jolt of 14,400 volts, which would change his life forever. As Paul says, "Others carried me until I could carry myself again." He found through depression and pain as a triple amputee, there were others that cared, there were important things yet for him to do, and there was "sun above the clouds."
